INTRODUCTION

The Powerful Young Project is an initiative of HC Nature's Enterprise. HC Nature's Enterprise is a social enterprise that identified a need to harness the raw talents and abilities of students nationwide. The Powerful Young Project is in three phases:

Phase 1: Organizing tutorials for students in primary schools about to take the Common Entrance Examination into secondary schools.

Phase 2: A Summer program that involves life studies, cognitive development, skill enhancement and Junior Secondary School (JSS) course work.

Phase 3: Guidance and mentoring of selected students throughout their secondary education.

AIM

The aim of this project is to improve and stimulate cognitive development as well as to create avenues for individuals to groom their talents towards nation building.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. To explore and harness the inbuilt potentials of students by creating opportunities and platforms for effective applications and utilizations of latent and manifest attributes.
- 2. To build up a patriotic mind-set and teach Nigerian children '360° Education' which comprises:
 - Knowing their books;
 - Knowing how to act;
 - Knowing how to live;
 - Knowing how to manage their time;
 - Knowing how to be successful in life.

PHASE 1

The first phase which involved preparing students for the Common Entrance Examination commenced on 24th January, 2016 and ended 24th July, 2016 with the lessons spanning twenty-two weeks (Sundays between 2:30pm & 5pm). A total of 181 students were registered for the program with an average attendance of 57 students. (Full details can be found in the Phase 1 Report)

The Common Entrance Examination results came out during the summer and we saw three of PYP students topping their respective schools and one of them coming third in the Festac district, Lagos, Nigeria. Approximately eighty-five percent (85%) of our students passed the Common Entrance Examination according to records checked till date.

PHASE 2

- The second phase which is the PYP summer program began on 4th August, 2016 and ran for a period of six weeks (although initially planned to run for five weeks).
- The training took place every Thursday through Saturday from 9am to 2pm at Christian Council School.
- A total of *thirty-two* (32) students were enrolled with an average attendance of twenty-five students. We had *five new students* from the school that provided us with a location to use.
- We taught introduction to JSS 1 syllabus as well as other classes that encompassed the '360° Education' we stand for.
- The JSS 1 syllabus covered include: Mathematics, English, Integrated Science, Introductory Technology, Social Studies and Business Studies.
- Other classes included Creative Writing, Cognitive Development Class (CDC), Handwriting and Life Studies.
- The life study classes covered the following topics:
 - o Team Spirit and Leadership by Somto Nwankwo
 - o Time management by Adewumi Ojuolape
 - o Goal setting by Aghogho Etaikhibuebu
 - o Food and Nutrition by Nnamdi Okoli

- Description of some of the activities engaged in during the lessons include:
 - Advertizing Competition: This was done in the creative writing class in order to build verbal confidence, collaboration and creativity. The students teamed up and advertised a particular candy. This exercise was so impactful that the final project was for the kids to advertise Nigeria.
 - o Random Creativity Game: This creativity game involved students picking from random materials presented by the facilitator and creating anything from them. This was done to ascertain within the minds of the students that everyone is intelligent in one form or the other and that everyone can be creative if they tried.
 - Origami: Student's engaged in origami lessons to spark up their creativity and innovation
 - o *I am special because:* In this activity, students wrote essays on why they are special and presented it to the class.
 - Food Presentation: During the food and nutrition class, students paired up to make sandwiches and presented them for judging by the facilitators present.
- A reading class was organized to further teach those that could not read and write properly.
- Discover Nigeria Project: Towards the end of the summer program, students were grouped to come up with ideas for advertising Nigeria. This was termed the

Discover Nigeria Project. Students were to use advertising strategies acquired during the creative writing classes. They were supervised by a facilitator whose role was only to guide and ensure team work was being practiced. Projects were presented to parents and the audience present at the closing event which held on the 11th of September, 2016. Groups were judged based on their presentation skills, confidence, timeliness, knowledge and creativity. Winners were privy to lunch at an eatery.

- During the event we had a reunion with PYP kids of 2015 where we followed up on how their lives had been so far. (Of course majority of them had stopped filling their goal books.) Prior to this we had called their parents to find out how they were doing and this served as a background on relating with them.

CHALLENGES AND PROPOSED SOLUTIONS

- The implementation of an additional week to the summer program, resulted in about 20 percent of our students stopped coming reducing the class size to about 25 students. This was probably due to prescheduled vacations. Thus better planning will be implemented to avoid last minute modifications to the schedules.
- There was emotional outburst from students who did not win any awards or the competition. Some of the outcry was over the usage of the term 'best' in describing the awards. For future reference, we decided to rename the awards

from 'best in math' to 'the math award' (Already made the changes in the awards descriptions above)
